

Bwlchgwyn Cattery Vaccination Policy

All cats admitted into the cattery must carry a current vaccination certificate for cat 'flu (feline herpesvirus and feline calicivirus) and feline enteritis (feline panleukopenia virus). A valid certificate/record must be produced for inspection: without it we will not be able to board your cat.

The certificate must be valid up to and including the last day of stay

The record should show one of the following:

- For cats with no previous vaccination history, both sets of injections must be completed 10 days prior to entry (approx 31days from 1st)
- An annual booster has been administered to a cat previously vaccinated cat but no more than 14 (fourteen) months after the previous vaccination.
- A previously vaccinated cat has had a complete course after more than 14 months have elapsed following the previous injection. The second injection was given at least 7 days prior to entry

feline leukaemia* Pet insurance does not cover this illness unless your cat has been vaccinated for feline leukaemia.

Please return this slip if you have more than one cat and you wish them to share the same unit. The unit will be of suitable size, according to the licensing regulations. In an emergency, 3+ cats from one household may have to be held in smaller accommodation for up to 24 hours.

Allianz Insurance covers your cat for up to £1500 for 30days per visit. After 30 days we have to pay £11/cat/month. Conditions apply. Pre-existing conditions may not be covered. (FIV & Feline Leukaemia, unless vaccinated, are not covered)

ONLY IF NECESSARY:

I give permission to talk to the veterinary practice prior to boarding to confirm vaccination dates and state of health for cats welfare during boarding and also after boarding if an illness has arisen during their boarding stay.
